In the interest of keeping the public informed of administrative matters on a regular basis, I am providing this report for your review and consideration:

Administration

- There are a number of changes in the state legislature that took place effectively on July 1. One in particular relates to the Village taking anonymous code enforcement complaints. The Village can no longer initiate code enforcement investigations based on anonymous complaints unless the code enforcement officer has reason to believe that the violation presents an imminent threat to public health, safety or welfare. This might impair our ability to enforce certain violations that we are not able to see by our own personal innvestigation. At any rate, I have attached SB 60 for your review.
- Mr. Robert Guerrero has submitted his letter of retirement effective August 6, 2021. I heard that he planned to retire in August but was not sure of the exact date. We are planning to have a retirement lunch before August 6th and a Council plaque on August 19th to be presented before the Council recognizing Robert's service with the Village.
