



In the interest of keeping the public informed of administrative matters on a regular basis, I am providing this report for your review and consideration:

## Administration

-On Wednesday, August 18, Pike, an FPL contractor, broke a water main behind South State Bank. There were a total of eight or nine businesses affected. The water main break was fixed shortly thereafter. The Village issued a boil water advisory to those affected businesses. On Friday, August 20, 2021, the boil water advisory was lifted after we were notified that the water after being tested from our certified lab, that the samples are free from contamination. The water and sewer personnel and the utility billing clerks responded promptly with handling and notifying the affected parties and should be commended for a job well done.

-As a reminder, I will be out of the office on Wednesday, August 25th all day. During my absence, Susan Owens, the Village Clerk will be in charge for the day. I plan on being at work the following day.

### Important Information

On Friday, August 13, the Florida Department of Health (FDOH) in Martin County delivered a short presentation on the state of COVID throughout Florida. ### Code Compliance Division


The Code Compliance Division would like to note it has currently recorded \$3,600 in outstanding administrative fees owed to the Village. This outstanding balance results from the case preparation process where an administrative fee of \$150 is levied against every case presented before the Special Magistrate. Further information will be provided on this issue when available.

### Economic Development Division

The Business Services Division would like to report that retail recruitment is ongoing throughout the Village. The Retail Coach is in contact with their twenty-five (25) retail targets. A progress summary is included below in the attached Economic Development Report.

### Building Services Division

The Building Services Division is currently reviewing and updating their checklists and standard operating procedures to comply with new Florida Statutes. Once these updates are completed, staff will be trained in the new procedures to maintain continuity with Florida State law.



### Planning and Zoning Division

The Planning and Development Division would like to report that two (2) new active applications were received during the last reporting period. The first of these projects is known as Seminole Junction. The second is a Petition for Re-Zoning within the Village. Further information on these projects can be found in the attached CED Department Report.

## Financial Services Department

Departmental staff is working to develop and prepare the FY 2021-2022 budget for the upcoming fiscal year. As such, regular updates will be provided to Council as the process continues into September 2021. As of now, the Village has two (2) Budget Workshops remaining:

- Thursday, August 26 at 6:30 PM, at Village Hall in the Council's Chambers.
- Wednesday, September 1 at 6:30 PM, at Village Hall in the Council's Chambers.

Additionally, the most recent monthly Report provided by Grants Writer and Administrator, Tracy Bryant, is attached to this document for review alongside several grant acceptance letters.

## Parks and Recreation Department

Departmental staff is working with members of the public, the Indiantown Chamber of Commerce, and the Indiantown Village Council to coordinate Holiday events throughout the next several months. Specifically, a focus on the annual Christmas Parade and the following event at Post Family Park are in planning. Further information will be provided on this event when available.

## Public Works and Engineering Department

The Village's Public Works Director, William Archebelle, has several items to highlight. If you have questions, concerns, or wish to report a public works related issue, please contact [publicworks@indiantownfl.gov](mailto:publicworks@indiantownfl.gov).

- The Village Public Works Department continues to coordinate with consultant's and contractors to develop growth projections, manage Water & Wastewater Plant upgrades, and pursue grant funding for uptown drainage and wastewater collection system improvements.
- PRP Construction recently completed emergency drainage repairs at Palm Beach Road and the Rolling Canal. Once repairs have been given a chance to settle, Sod will be installed. This install is predicted to occur within the next two (2) weeks.
- Finally, staff is planning to evaluate improvement bid applications for the Booker Park Roadway and Stormwater Drainage Improvement Project next Monday. Once review is complete, a recommendation will be generated and delivered to the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT).

## Water + Wastewater Utilities Department

Departmental staff is happy to report one of our technicians, Jaime Andres, has acquired his Florida State Class C Wastewater License from the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEM). As of Wednesday, August 11, Mr. Andres now has both his Water and Wastewater Licenses. We applaud him advancing his knowledge and his outstanding dedication to the Utility Industry.

Utilities Manager, Jim Hewitt, is pleased to note both new departmental employees are scheduled to train for their Water & Wastewater Distribution Exams during the next six months.

Departmental Staff will be working to install Radio Read Meters throughout the next few weeks. Meters will be installed in the northwest quadrant of the Village between 150<sup>th</sup>, 151<sup>st</sup>, Osceola St., and 153<sup>rd</sup>, to the west of Adams Ave. Staff will need to access the rear alley of resident's homes to install. Finally, the previously purchased High Service Pumps, meant to replace our old pumps, are currently scheduled to arrive in the Village in mid-September. Delivery of the pumps has been delayed due to part shortages resulting from the COVID-19 outbreak.

### CODE COMPLIANCE HIGHLIGHTS







COVID-19 Cases, Martin County, Previous 14 Days




# Martin Cases by Month, 2021

COVID-19 cases by Month, Martin, 2021




# Martin Cases by Age Group, 2021

COVID-19 cases by Age Group, Martin, 2021









## Number of doses administered in the past 10 weeks

















## Vaccination notes

Data in this summary pertain to COVID-19 vaccines approved by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration and have been issued an Emergency Use Authorization (Janssen COVID-19 Vaccine, Moderna COVID-19 Vaccine and Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 Vaccine). These data summarize the number of people who have received either their first dose or have completed the series for a COVID-19 vaccine. A person can only be counted in one category, first dose or series complete. 
